



Hearing Aids for Little Ears

Keeping hearing aids on little ears is important for learning to listen and talk. Here are some tips for your baby to get the most listening possible from the hearing aids.

ASK YOUR AUDIOLOGIST ABOUT:

- A hearing aid care kit that has a listening tube, so that you can listen to the hearing aid to make sure it is working well.**
- A dry aid kit to store the hearing aids in to reduce moisture, preserve the hearing aids, and keep them safe from children and pets.**
- Capability of attaching the hearing aid to an FM/DM and/or remote microphone technology, computer and telephone.**
- Water resistant hearing aids so they can be worn while bathing and splashing in the pool.**
- Accessories that can keep the hearing aid on your baby, such as special bonnets, "huggies," and clips.**
- Setting the controls on the hearing aids so that little fingers cannot change the settings.**
- Using infant sized ear hooks that fit well on your baby's ears.**
- A tamper-proof battery compartment for your child's safety.**
