



Questions To Ask Your Early Interventionist About LSL Services

You have a short critical window of time for your baby to develop listening and spoken language, which means you'll want to have high expectations for the professional providing early intervention services to you and your baby. Here are key questions to ask:

- 1 **What is your knowledge and experience using a LSL approach?**
- 2 **What is your knowledge and experience working specifically with infants and toddlers (birth-3 years) using a LSL approach?**
- 3 **How often will services be provided, for how long, and where? Do you offer tele-intervention services?**
- 4 **How will you evaluate, set LSL goals, and monitor my baby's progress toward spoken language development?**
- 5 **What are your expectations for my role as my baby's first teacher and how will we work together?**
- 6 **What types of intervention activities will you teach my baby and me?**
- 7 **How will you share information with me and other members of my baby's team?**
- 8 **Could I meet other children and families you currently serve as well as past graduates?**
