



Share Your LSL Story

Stories are powerful things. For the past 12 years, people all over America have been sharing their stories through a project called StoryCorps. StoryCorps' mission is to record, preserve, and share the stories of Americans from all backgrounds and beliefs. Your family can help by contributing your LSL story. Why? Because this is one more way the LSL story needs to be told. Because there are families who haven't heard these stories yet and do not yet know what's possible for children who are deaf and hard of hearing. So go tell your LSL story!

Start by interviewing the people closest to you. Children should interview their parents, their interventionist, and even their grandparents. Here are some questions to kickoff the storytelling:

Questions for a Child Interviewing Their PARENT

- How did you find out I had hearing loss?
- How old was I?
- What did you think?
- What did you do?
- How did you decide you wanted me to listen and talk?
- What did I do when I got my first hearing aids?
- What did I do when I started intervention?
- Tell me some stories about what I did in intervention when I was little?

Questions for a Child Interviewing Their INTERVENTIONIST

- How old was I when you met me?
- What did I do?
- Tell me some stories about me in sessions with you.

Questions for a Child Interviewing Their GRANDPARENTS

- How did you hear about my hearing loss?
- What did you think?
- Did my mom and dad talk with you? What did everyone think and say?
